Commissioners Report – Lacey Trimble, Deputy Commissioner

- Welcomed newest board members
- Bail Reform took effect January 1, 2020. Significantly less inmates in Orange County Jail. Current proposed legislation to delay bail reform for six months.
- Continued conversations with moving our clinic out the jail. Sheriff’s Office will put out and Request for Proposal (RFP) to contract for the Mental Health Services within the Jail.
- Nation Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA) “healing communities” grant – we continue to canvass applicants for the two positions – Program Director and Epidemiologist. These are contractual positions for a limited time frame.
- Co-location for Children’s Single Point of Access (Children’s SPOA) is being explored, Probation, DSS and MH staff co-location.
- Proposed Mental Health Days for students – currently still in committee and no updates.

Kyle Roddy and Lori Hulle – Substance Abuse, Lisa Hayes and Wanda McQueen – Developmental Disabilities, and Nora Shepard

Sub-Committee Report-out:

Substance Use Disorder: Matt Corrigan – Lack of crisis stabilization beds in county.

Recommendation: The SA Sub-committee would like the full CSB to work with Commissioner Miller and her staff to create access to some number of crisis stabilization beds, for community members with SUD, to be fully available on a 24 – 7 basis. This could be through work with the two existing 820 programs who are licensed by OASAS to provide crisis stabilization or perhaps

with another provider. It seems as though we have a much needed service available in Orange County that is not used to the full advantage of the community.

Motion from Matt, second Tenise, all in favor – motion approved.

Recommendation: Replace the vacant position for Director of Developmental Disabilities Program Services. Lacey announced, we have provisionally filled the position by promoting a long term employee with the MH Department, Christine Smallin. Official Announcement has not yet gone out.

Developmental Disabilities Sub-Committee – Patricia Quinn – Christine Smallin attended the DD subcommittee meeting, she is very knowledgeable and involved in DD services. This sub-committee is currently discussing the following item: 911 registry, Project Lifesaver, and prioritizing the lack of recreational and socialization programs for people over the age of 18. Next meeting is scheduled for Feb. 3, 5:30 PM @ OCDMH.

Mental Health Sub-Committee – Nolly Climes – This sub-committee is currently addressing ongoing issues for providers with regard to salary and high turnover. Senator Metzger made some commitment to work w/legislators regarding deficits. Concerns with local hospitals, clients struggling on MH unit, high level of concern w/transferring people to jail. Dept. of Mental Health has scheduled quarterly meetings with our local hospital to address issues as they arise. Continue to struggle in the community with lack of child psychiatry. Successes: crisis response increased a slot on the ACT team. Trauma Conferences have been successful throughout the year.

New Business:

Sub-committees attending full CSB Meetings quarterly – all meetings are open. Regina will send all sub-committee members the meeting dates. If they would like to attend they are more than welcome. Motion from Matt Corrigan to send an invite to all members for either the April or May meeting, and ask for an RSVP, as we may need the larger conference room. Lori Hulle second, all in favor, motion carried.
