WHEREAS, Honorable Steven M. Neuhaus, County Executive, has notified the County Legislature that he has made the appointment of:

Alan J. Sorenson, residing in Rock Hill, New York, as Commissioner of the Department of Planning for the County of Orange, pursuant to Article IX, Section 9-1 of the Orange County Charter. Said appointment is effective March 16, 2020.

RESOLVED, that the above said appointment be and the same hereby is confirmed.

Mr. Paduch stated that he had questions regarding the Hatch Act regarding Mr. Sorensen. They did receive a memo from the United States Office of Special Counsel, however he still has concerns because from what he read, Mr. Sorensen's salary is not completely paid by federal loans or grants so he is fine with that part of the Hatch Act. However, it also states that if any state or local employee is covered or if the employee works in connection with a covered employee who runs for office that would violate the Hatch Act. His concern is that he does receive federal transportation aid and he is partially paid by federal funds, so the Hatch Act information eliminated the funding part but did not eliminate the concern that Mr. Sorensen would be in charge of federal aid. His other concern was that there were three people who applied, one being Mr. Sorensen who is being hired at the cap. David Church work for years to get to his salary before retiring and now we hire Mr. Sorensen at the cap. He added that Mr. Sorensen sits on the Sullivan County Legislature and his focus will be in Sullivan County. He felt that he has a great background for the position but he strongly felt he should give up his position as Sullivan County Legislator. He was not sure if Mr. Sorensen closed his planning consultant business yet. He did not think he would spend as much time in Orange County as David Church did. He felt there were too many conflicts and planned to vote no.

Mr. Faggione asked his fellow Legislators to support the appointment of Mr. Sorensen as Commissioner for the Department of Planning for Orange County. He worked closely with him and he has jumped into a hot situation and he is leading the department professionally.

Mr. Paduch asked for Legislative Counsel to provide an opinion regarding Mr. Sorensen and the Hatch Act.

Chairman Brescia stated that he wished Mr. Paduch reached out to Mr. Porr last week regarding his concerns. He added that they received legal opinions in regard to his questions during committee, but if he had other concerns he wished he addressed them prior to the Legislative Session because there was plenty of time.

Mr. Paduch stated that they just received information back from the Office of Special Counsel and it was very clear regarding the federal transportation aid and the Hatch Act. His concern was why were they not taking the information that they asked. He did not think it was an appropriate appointment.

Ms. Reed commented that the County Executive's Office can take the appropriate action to shield Mr. Sorensen's duties so that any federal transit funds are not used to fund his position. They can use other funds or county taxation which would shield him from Hatch Act issues. If there are any conflict issues they would go before the Board of Ethics. She was unsure if Mr. Sorensen did that but that is an alternate option. She was confident that the County Executive and his counsel reviewed these issues intensely. They would not have hired Mr. Sorensen as a candidate if it was in violation of the Hatch Act.

Mr. Paduch stressed his concern with transportation aid in the future due to this and added that he would hold everyone responsible.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE ORANGE COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF MENTAL HEALTH, TO ACCEPT AND APPROPRIATE FUNDS FROM THE NATIONAL INSTITUTE ON DRUG ABUSE (NIDA), PURSUANT TO SECTION 99-h OF THE GENERAL MUNICIPAL LAW AND SECTION 4.09 OF THE ORANGE COUNTY CHARTER.

WHEREAS, the Orange County Department of Mental Health is seeking to accept and appropriate \$217,693.00 for 2020 in National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA) funds in collaboration with Columbia University to implement the HEALing Communities Study (HCS) as a Wave 2 community; and

WHEREAS, the overarching objective of the HCS is to test the impact of a community-engaged intervention on the primary outcome of community-level opioid overdose (OD) deaths. The HCS will test the impact of a comprehensive, data-driven community response plan to deploy evidence-based practices across multiple sectors to reduce opioid-related overdose deaths; and

WHEREAS, the primary goal is to reduce opioid-related OD deaths by 40 percent in Wave 1 communities receiving the HCS intervention during the second year of implementation compared to Wave 2 communities that will receive the intervention after the second year. A total of sixty-seven (67) communities in four states (Kentucky, Massachusetts, New York, and Ohio) will be enrolled in the study to measure the impact of the intervention; and

WHEREAS, this Legislature does wish to accept and appropriate said funds for the Department of Mental Health as indicated above.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby

The entry of such Order shall restore all parties, including owner, mortgagees and any and all lienors, receivers and administrators and encumbrancers, to the status they held at the time the County acquired title to said property as if the judgment had never been rendered, and shall render said property liable for all taxes, beneficiaries, management fees and liens, penalties, interest, and other charges which shall accrue subsequent to those paid in order to obtain the release provided for or which were, for whatever reason, omitted from the payment made to obtain such release.

RESOLUTION OF THE ORANGE COUNTY LEGISLATURE REQUESTING AND URGING THE GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK TO ISSUE A WAIVER OF ANY APPLICABLE STATE LAWS AND PROVIDE GUIDELINES FOR THE PURPOSE OF AUTHORIZING LOCAL INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCIES TO USE NON-OBLIGATED CASH FUNDS FOR LOW INTEREST OR NO INTEREST LOANS TO SMALL BUSINESSES WITHIN THEIR JURISDICTIONS WHO ARE EXPERIENCING FINANCIAL HARDSHIP AS A RESULT OF THE COVID-19 CRISIS.

WHEREAS, small local businesses around the state have been devastated by the impact of the COVID-19 crisis. A recent survey conducted by the Orange County Chamber of Commerce to its membership (over 1,000 businesses) revealed that the overwhelming majority of businesses have been drastically impacted financially by the crisis. This is happening across New York State, the nation and the world.; and

WHEREAS, municipal leaders and local businesses are reaching out to their local industrial development agencies seeking short term financial assistance to help them out during this unprecedented economic crisis; and

WHEREAS, Industrial Development Agencies are constrained by the laws of the State of New York to provide such assistance.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that We, the Orange County Legislature, hereby request and urge Honorable Andrew M. Cuomo, Governor of the State of New York to waive any applicable state law and provide guidelines to enable local Industrial Development Agencies to either:

- Make direct loans to small businesses in non-prime loan positions up to \$50,000; or
- Authorize Industrial Development Agencies to transfer to affiliated Local Development Corporations such funds and enable those LDCs to make such loan to small businesses within their district.

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Legislature be and is authorized and directed to send a certified copy of this resolution to the Honorable Andrew M. Cuomo, Governor of the State of New York, Honorable Thomas DiNapoli, New York State Comptroller, Oversight Director at the Authorities Budget Office, Jeffrey Pearlman, Esq. and to each State Senator and Assembly person whose districts include all or part of Orange County, to Steven Acquario, Director of New York State Association of Counties and to the Orange County Industrial Development Agencies so that they may be apprised hereof and take all necessary and appropriate action to implement this request.

Mr. Benton stated that he was in support of the resolution and would like for the Industrial Development Agency to be in charge of it and that the grants are sensible in size and in terms.

Ms. Stegenga supported the resolution and was hopeful that they can focus on the small "Mom and Pop" stores as a priority before they move on to larger businesses.

Chairman Brescia stated if there was anyone who had suggestions for the IDA to reach out to Laurie Villasuso or Vinnie Cozzolino. He added that since the middle of March, the IDA dedicated senior staff to develop and build the OCFC Loan Program from scratch. They have two staff members who field phone calls from Orange County businesses that need help regarding employee issues, grant questions or unemployment concerns. They have spoken with over thirty businesses to provide business counseling. They have enabled five companies to produce personal protective equipment (PPE) for local healthcare workers. They announced that \$500,000 will be appropriated for a loan fund. He has been in constant contact with the IDA and they are all doing a wonderful job.

Mr. Tuohy supported the resolution but would like the \$500,000 be increase to \$1 million.

Chairman Brescia clarified that it could not be increased to \$1 million out of the Funding Corporation because there is only \$500,000 to \$600,000 in the account. He stated that if the Governor provides an executive order allowing the IDA to tap into the funds in the main account, so there is potential.

Mr. Paduch stated his caucus had some concern regarding various issues. He shared with his caucus that the committee chairs have been informed all issues can be addressed during the committees this month.

Chairman Brescia asked if the committee meetings were going to be done via teleconference.

Ms. Reed responded the staff and Information Technology Department have been working hard on it and looking into video conferencing.

Mr. Paduch stated that he was available to help if it was needed. He mentioned that he spoke with Ms. Bonelli about the funded but unfilled positions which they were trying to get on the agenda for today. It would save the county \$15 to \$16 million, he talked about that during the budget process. It would be an additional millions of dollars they would have to supplement the budget that they lost in sales tax revenues. He was hopeful that this would come to committee this month and that is why it is important for everyone to be included in the calls, although it has been difficult, he wants to make sure everyone can hear the information and their concerns addressed.

Ms. Reed stated that they are trying to abide by the governor's stay at home policy. There is a two-week break before committees start so hopefully they will be in a better situation and she thanked Mr. Paduch for his assistance.

Chairman Brescia stated that would be addressed at the Personnel and Compensation committee regarding the unfunded positions. He was sure the County Executive has plans not to fill them along with making cuts in various departments and capital projects. He added that he had a virtual meeting via Zoom and perhaps that is something the office could look into for our meetings.

Ms. Reed pointed out that Legislators need to be careful what software they use for audio/visual and to confer with Commissioner Burpoe because some programs are not secure for governmental operations.

Mr. Faggione took note of the progress that the Legislature has taken to get to where they are today and he sees it as an opportunity to use the technology they have in place which can save on paper and other wasted material.

Mr. Amo concurred wholeheartedly with Mr. Faggione. It would be great to use the new technology in the new building. It was unfortunate that due to this situation it is forcing them to do it but it will be good for all in the end.

Mr. Minuta stressed his support on moving forward with the technology and it would make things a lot more efficient.
