Historically, wastewater containing AFFF has been discharged to publically owned, federally owned, and industrial wastewater treatment plants if there was an agreement to do so, and in accordance with utility-specific guidelines and permit limits. Compliance is monitored as required by the treatment plant permit to ensure permit limit categorical standards and local standards developed by the treatment plant are achieved. In the past wastewater treatment plant concerns were not focused on PFOS/PFOA solely as a contaminant, but on biochemical oxygen demand (BOD), chemical oxygen demand (COD), and foaming issues at the plant prior to effluent being discharged to natural waters.</p> <p>Air Force installations were already seeking permission for discharge of wastewater with AFFF content due to the BOD/COD and foaming issues; however, specific language was written into AFI 32-1067 prohibiting the discharge of substances containing perfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) to storm sewer systems, and to sanitary sewers, unless allowed by the utility. Additionally, firefighting solutions from fire systems test activation and fire vehicle chemical discharges are captured, contained, and disposed of in a manner that mitigates release of PFAS to the environment, and releases to sewers cannot occur prior obtaining approval of the receiving wastewater treatment plan.</p>	SAF/IEE
