## Final Notice and Public Explanation of Proposed Activities in a 100-Year Floodplain County of Orange

To: All interested Agencies, Groups and Individuals

This is to give notice that Orange County has conducted an evaluation as required by Executive Orders 11988 and 11990, in accordance with HUD regulations at 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management, to determine the potential effect that its activities in the floodplain and wetlands will have on the human environment for the county's Community Development Block Grant and Home Investment Partnerships Program that are funded through grants from HUD. The proposed activities are:

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Orange County has concluded that, because the activities to be undertaken include only rehabilitation of existing structures, there is no practical alternative to conducting these activities within the floodplain. Implementation of the projects will be designed so that no mitigation techniques are necessary to avoid adverse impacts on the floodplain or to restore and preserve the natural or beneficial values of the floodplain. The proposed activities will conform to applicable State or local floodplain protection procedures and the criteria of the National Flood Insurance Program.

Orange County has determined that the proposed activities will have no significant impact on the environment because the proposed activities are limited to rehabilitation of existing structures that will not impede the floodplain. The County has prepared an Environmental Review Record (ERR) that documents compliance with compliance with Executive Orders 11988 and 11990. The ERR, which is available for public inspection and copying at the County Office of Community Development at the address below during normal business hours, documents the reasons why the projects must be located in a floodplain; a description of all significant facts considered in making the determination, including alternative sites and actions, and any mitigating techniques incorporated into the projects as proposed.

There are three primary purposes for this notice. First, people who may be affected by activities in floodplains and those who have an interest in the protection of the natural environment should be given an opportunity to express their concerns and provide information about these areas. Second, an adequate public notice program can be an important public educational tool. The dissemination of information about floodplains can facilitate and enhance Federal efforts to reduce the risks associated with the occupancy and modification of these special areas. Third, as a matter of fairness, when the Federal government determines it will participate in actions taking place in floodplains, it must inform those who may be put at greater or continued risk.
