These notices shall satisfy two separate but related procedural requirements for activities to be undertaken by Orange County.

REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS

On or about May 3, 2021, the County of Orange will submit a request to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to release federal Community Development Block Grant funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (P.L. 93383) and HOME Investment Partnerships Program funds under Section 228 of the Cranston-Gonzalez National Affordable Housing Act (NAHA) to be used for the following projects in the County:

V. South Blooming Grove Prospect Road Drainage: Roadside storm sewer swales have over time collected large amounts of silt deposits in low sloping areas. This impedes stormwater runoff and causes stagnant water conditions. This project involves the reshaping and re-sloping of approximately 930 0linear feet of roadside swales in the Village of South Blooming Grove. Projected 2021 CDBG funding \$100,000

V. Otisville NYS 211 Watermain Replacement: Project involves replacement of approximately 1,500 liner feet of 4 inch water main with 8 inch water main. In addition one new fire hydrant will be installed and approximately 19 services will be replaced to the property lines. Work will occur along NYS Route 211 from County Route 90 (Sanitorium Ave.) to Shoddy Hollow Road in the Village of Otisville, Orange County. Projected 2021 CDBG funding \$125,000

PACER-24 Roberts Street Middletown-Rehabilitation: Project involves rehabilitation of 24 Robert Street in the City of Middletown, which contains eight SRO units for single men exiting homelessness, incarceration or mental health facility. Improvements include bathroom renovation, interior lead and asbestos remediation, roof repair, and other exterior improvements to stabilize the building and improve safety and code-related items. Projected 2021 HOME funding \$196,111

FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT (FONSI)

The County has determined that the projects will have no significant impact on the human environment. Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) of 1969 is not required. Additional project information is contained in the Environmental Review Record (ERR). The ERR will be made available to the public for review either electronically or by U.S. mail. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Any individual, group or agency may submit written comments on the ERR to the Director of the Orange County Office of Community Development; 40 Matthews Street, Suite 307A; Goshen, NY 10924. All comments received by April 30, 2021, will be considered by the County of Orange prior to authorizing submission of a request for release of funds.

ENVIRONMENTAL CERTIFICATION

The County of Orange certifies to HUD that Steven M. Neuhaus, in his capacity as County Executive of the County of Orange, consents to accept the jurisdiction of the federal courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process, and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. HUD's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities and allows the County of Orange to use CDBG and HOME Program funds.

OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS

HUD will accept objections to its release of funds and the County of Orange's certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of the County of Orange; (b) the County of Orange has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR part 58; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in the development process have committed funds, incurred costs or undertaken activities not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by HUD; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted via email in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58, Sec. 58.76) and shall be addressed to the New York Office of Community Planning and Development CPD_COVID-19OEE-NY@hud.gov. Potential objectors should contact HUD New York via email to verify the actual last day of the objection period.
