You Have to Be Regulated Before You Can Learn

About the Program:

The demands placed on children are greater than ever before. While the demands have changed, what hasn't changed is the course of human development. Current advances in neuroscience have taught us so much about how the brain works and what kids need so they can feel safe, regulated, and ready to meet the expectations in a variety of environments. In order to help children to succeed, we need to consider where they are, both physiologically and emotionally.

This 3-hour workshop will review how sensorimotor development and sensory processing impacts a child's ability to meet expectations. We will discuss traditional "behavior management" approaches and present new, evidence-based ideas that teach children the skills they need to do well, because kids always want to do well. This workshop will put a fresh spin on sensory processing and self-regulation in education. Participants will see "behaviors" through new lenses and provide the strategies necessary to help kids show us just how capable, and *sensational*, they are.

Greg Santucci is a Pediatric Occupational Therapist and the Founding Director of Power Play Pediatric Therapy. He has been an OT for over 20 years, and currently is a Supervisor of Occupational Therapy at Children's Specialized Hospital in NJ.
