- Dr. Michael Edelstein, Orange Environment's President Emeritus and a Climate Reality Leader, will give a brief overview of the climate crisis and the need for rapid decarbonization, including the implications for Orange County and other Mid-Hudson residents and municipalities. Dr. Edelstein's students at Ramapo College of New Jersey recently completed a rapid decarbonization study for Bergen County New Jersey.
- Dr. Ludmila Smirnova, Professor of Education at Mount Saint Mary College, will discuss how teachers can bring climate and sustainability into their classrooms and how student clubs can play a major role in addressing global warming.
- Fadoua Brour, who is currently heading up Orange Environment's energy transition and decarbonization program, will discuss how easy it is for residents to add solar energy to their homes. Brour is a Moroccan attorney who spearheaded climate action across North Africa and who recently completed a joint master's degree in environmental policy and Green MBA from Bard College.
