Treatment Improvement Protocol (TIP) 39: Substance Use Disorder Treatment and Family Therapy Series

About the Program:

The evidence base demonstrates that family involvement increases the effectiveness of substance use treatment, and yet few service providers working in the field of substance abuse treatment have had access to training in family therapy (FT). Providers equipped with a systemic, relational and culturally sensitive framework and trained in key principles and techniques of FT will be better able to provide “family friendly” therapeutic support to clients, thereby increasing the effectiveness of their services.

Working from a “family friendly” orientation is not merely a matter of engaging a set of discrete “family friendly” techniques, but rather can be understood as the ongoing engagement of a systemic, relational and culturally sensitive framework, of which these discrete techniques are a manifestation.

At the conclusion of this series, participants will be able to:

1. Identify the differences in theory and practice between the fields of substance abuse treatment and family therapy.
2. Explain common family therapy approaches that can be adopted and adapted by substance abuse counselors.
3. Describe common substance abuse treatment approaches that can be used by family therapists.
4. Integrate family counseling into addiction and substance use treatment.
