AN ARTIST'S RESPONSE TO HUMAN RIGHTS

RULES FOR VISUAL ART WORK

- Artist must be a high school junior or senior attending school in Orange County.
- Art work must illustrate any one of the 30 Articles of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. Unrelated submissions will not be accepted.
- All work must be original and created in 2017.
- One piece per artist. Any medium will be accepted as long as the piece can be safely exhibited.
- Two-dimensional work should not exceed 30" in any direction, inclusive of frame or mat.
- If not framed, work must be mounted on a rigid mat and able to be hung with appropriate fixatives-wire and frames preferred. No Velcro.
- Three-dimensional work must not exceed 30 lbs.
- **Submissions MUST include the following, or may not be accepted:**
 - **An electronic version** (via email to humanrights@orangecountygov.com or flash drive) of the typed **Student Interpretation Form** (size 14 Arial font, no more than 150 words, must be submitted in form provided)
 - **Two typed and printed Submission ID Forms** (one attached to the back of the art work, the other handed in with the Release Form and Permission Form)
 - **The signed Artist Release and Guardian Permission Forms**
- Students must submit their art work to their teacher by **Nov. 17th**.
- Art work must be delivered to exhibit sites on **Nov. 20th or 21st, between 2:30p.m. and 5:00 p.m.**
- Submissions will not be accepted after **Nov. 21st**.
- Art work will be exhibited at the location determined by the Human Rights Commission.
- The Human Rights Commission reserves the right to refuse any submission.
- All artists will receive a Certificate of Recognition at the Exhibit Opening and Artist Reception.

AN ARTIST'S RESPONSE TO HUMAN RIGHTS

RULES FOR LITERARY ART WORK

- Artist/Writer must be a high school junior or senior attending school in Orange County.
- Literary work must illustrate any one of the 30 Articles of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. Unrelated submissions will not be accepted.
- All work must be original and created in 2017.
- One piece per artist/writer.
- The poem or essay must be limited to one typed 8-1/2 x 11" page (plain white paper) **using size 14 Arial font** and mounted on black construction paper or poster board, using no more than a 1" border.
- Each literary work must contain student's name, school and Article # typed on the page.
- **Literary Submissions MUST include:**
 - A typed and printed **Submission ID Form**
 - The signed **Artist Release and Guardian Permission Forms**
- Students must submit their work to their teacher by **Nov. 17th**.
- Literary work must be delivered to exhibit sites on **Nov. 20th or 21st, between 2:30p.m. and 5:00 p.m.**
- Submissions will not be accepted after **Nov. 21st**.
- Literary work will be exhibited at the location determined by the Human Rights Commission.
- The Human Rights Commission reserves the right to refuse any submission.
- All artists/writers will receive a Certificate of Recognition at the Exhibit Opening and Artist Reception.
