## Sheriff Carl E. DuBois Announces Drug Arrest

**Town of Crawford, N.Y.** – Date of arrest January 15, 2018:

Orange County Sheriff's Deputies were conducting a property check of the Pine Bush Town Park on Red Mills Road in the Town of Crawford. Deputies observed two people sitting in a 2011 Nissan Altima with the motor running. The Deputies approached the vehicle to check on the occupants and upon making contact they smelled the odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle. Further investigation revealed the occupants to be in possession of 8 grams of Heroin, .2 grams of Crack Cocaine, 10.5 grams of Marijuana, 24 grams of edible Marijuana, 8 Percocet tablets, more than 67 Xanax tablets, 14 Oxycontin tablets and 8 Clonazepam tablets.

Arrested were Thomas C. Healy, 28, and Priscilla A. Carbajal, 25, both of the Town of Crawford. Healy and Carbajal were each charged with Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance in the Third Degree with Intent to Sell, a Class B Felony, Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance in the Fourth Degree, a Class C Felony, multiple counts of Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance in the Seventh Degree, Class A Misdemeanors, as well as Unlawful Possession of Marijuana, a Violation. Both defendants were arraigned before Town of Crawford Judge Mark Schuh and remanded to the Orange County Jail on \$25,000 cash bail or \$50,000 secured bond.

- A C C R E D I T A T I O N S -



A criminal charge is merely an allegation by the police that a defendant has committed a violation of the criminal law, and it is not evidence of guilt. All defendants are presumed innocent and entitled to a fair trial, during which it will be the State of New York's burden to prove guilt beyond a reasonable doubt.
